RORY: NO PLACE LIKE HOME OF GOLF

Fifteen years after all but securing his first European Tour card at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, Rory McIlroy reflects on his incredible journey and the memories he has made playing the Old Course with his father Gerry

or World No.2 Rory McIlroy, the Old Course at St Andrews is special not just as the Home of Golf, with an unmatched history in the sport, but also because it is the place where his own great career took off.

It was as an 18-year-old, in October 2007 and a month after turning professional, that McIlroy finished third in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. It was a performance that all but secured his European Tour card for the 2008 season, a status he confirmed with another good finish at the following week's Madrid Open.

"I have lots of great memories here, memories that will last a lifetime," said McIlroy, "and it was on this course that I got my European Tour card 15 years ago. It's been a great journey since."

Despite the success and the riches that journey has brought him, McIlroy said another visit to St Andrews allows him to think about where it all started. And a chance to once again partner his father Gerry this week helps him to keep that perspective, he says.

"When I look back over the 15 years, it's been an amazing life, and an amazing career. But you still have to remember where you came from, and I have to pinch myself sometimes about what has happened. I get to live out my childhood dreams and not everybody can say that, so it's an unbelievable position to be in.

"I'll always have a deep appreciation for St Andrews and what it means to our game. I sort of take a trip down memory lane every time I come here and just have a real appreciation for everything. And we're all playing the same game. My two-year-old daughter can swing a club and hit a ball, and grandparents can play with grandkids, and I can play with my dad here again this week, and sort of remind myself where I started."

Team McIlroy came as close as you can get to winning the event in 2019, their tie with the team of Tommy Fleetwood and Ogden Phipps only broken by Fleetwood's better final-round score compared to Rory.





US OPEN WIN GAVE FITZPATRICK FAMILY THE DREAM TICKET

Of all the trappings that come with a Major victory, Matt Fitzpatrick is happiest about getting to choose his own partner

S Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick was not entirely joking when he said on Wednesday that he was going to try harder to win the team event this week than to win the individual title - simply because of what it would mean to his mum Susan.

The Fitzpatricks are paired together in the Team Championship – with 21-handicapper Susan making her debut in the event – and her son said: "It would mean the world to my mum, and to be able to win something together, particularly as a family, is always a special feeling. It would be unbelievable if we did it.

"I'm being a bit serious when I say I'm not as bothered about the individual tournament. I'm just going to go out there and support my mum as best I can. I want her to enjoy it more than anything. I don't want her to be nervous or worried about anything."

On Saturday, a third member of the family will be added to the mix, when Matt's younger brother Alex, who turned professional earlier this year, will join their four-ball with his amateur partner Martin Slumbers, the chief executive of the R&A.

Despite everything he achieved


in taking down his first Major title at Brookline, it is the prospect of this situation that has left Matt scratching his head.

"It's fantastic and surreal," said Matt. "I was just thinking in the car on my way here that I'll be playing next to my brother in a European event on Saturday and I'll also be playing in a team with my mum when we come up the 18th at St Andrews. It really doesn't get much more special than that. It's exciting, and they are memories we will keep forever.


"I said to mum at the start of the year that if I got my world ranking high enough, we'd play together here. But if you have won a major, you can also pick your partner. So, winning the US Open confirmed that she could play, and I didn't need to fix the world ranking part!"

Fitzpatrick also revealed his father Russell, who will be supporting Susan, Matt and Alex from outside the ropes, is happy to be the only member of his immediate family not playing. "There's no way he could have played in front of people. He would be far too nervous for that!"

At least on Saturday, Russell will not have to dash between both Matt and Alex's matches to keep tabs on both his sons and his wife.







FOX: I'M THINKING OF SHANE

port lost an icon and cricket lost a legend - but Ryan Fox lost a friend. The sudden passing of Shane Warne in March this year impacted on the New Zealand golfer, who shared many happy moments with the Australian at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

He said: "It's great to be back but there's a tinge of sadness this time [at the loss of Warne]. I'll be thinking of him this week.

"As a professional athlete it was hard for Shane to give up the competitive side, so he really enjoyed that aspect of golf, especially with the putter.

"Swing wise he struggled a little bit at times, but if you wanted someone to hole a putt for your life, Warney was one of the guys you wouldn't mind doing it for you."

The relationship between Fox and Warne - who lost out in the team competition on a countback in 2021 - may have been forged across Scotland's famous links courses, but it was a friendship which went beyond their annual pairing.

He said: "I bowled leg-spin growing up and idolised Warney. So, to call him a mate was very special. He was based [in the UK] doing commentary and I spent a bit of time in London, so we played some golf together."

England cricketer Joe Root met Warne for the first time at the 2021 Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and the two formed an instant bond. He said: "As an Aussie legend he didn't have to sit down and talk cricket with me for two or three hours every night. He was amazing. I'll treasure that forever."

The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship celebrates links golf at its finest and is played over the Old Course at St Andrews, the Championship Course at Carnoustie and Kingsbarns Golf Links. The final round, after the cut is made on Saturday, is played over the Old Course.

With a total prize fund of US\$5million, there are two separate competitions - an individual professional tournament and a Team Championship, in which each professional is paired with an amateur.

LOUIS CAN MAKE MORE DUNHILL MEMORIES

South African returns to the scene of his greatest triumph

ouis Oosthuizen is looking forward to making more great St Andrews memories at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship - a tournament he fondly refers to as "a golf family".

The world No.34 returns to the Old Course, where he famously showed his love for Links golf when he won the 2010 Open Championship by a commanding seven strokes, including a memorable eagle on the famous Road Hole in the final round, to claim his first Major title.

"I'm delighted to be back at a tournament that always feels like a golf family," said the South African, who played with his brother Rikus as his amateur partner in the past. "What I love about Links golf is that ability to be creative and use your imagination."

Oosthuizen finished in the top three of three of the four Majors in 2021 and is a genuine contender for his first Dunhill title - he starts that quest at Carnoustie today.

However, it is the atmosphere around this event, as much as the trophy, that keeps the 39-year-old coming back.

"To see old friends and celebrate our shared love for this great game is what makes this one of the most special weeks in the year for me," he said. "It's always a week of great memories."





KATHRYN PLAYS AN OLD ROLE

Kathryn, pictured with Matt Wallace, was part of a championship-winning high school team and aged 15, she had entered the US Women's Open when she was offered the lead in the movie Paranormal Activity 4. She had to choose: acting or golf?

After appearing in Big Little Lies and with a role in the next Marvel movie, Kathryn can have few regrets about her choice.

She said: "To be able to play the most historic course in the world in a fully-fledged professional event will be a wonderful moment for me and I am really going to enjoy it."











BILL GOES BACK TO THE CADDYSHACK

hen Bill Murray shows up in St Andrews, we have learned to expect the unexpected.

It's been 42 years since Bill appeared in the classic comedy Caddyshack as Carl Spackler, perhaps the world's most famous greenkeeper.

As dawn broke a little after 5am on Tuesday morning, he went back to his roots - paying a visit to the men and women charged with keeping the Old Course looking beautiful and playing fair.

Bill met Gordon McKie, course manager at the Old Course, and his team of greenkeepers, and was shown some of the advances in technology that have taken place since he went to war against the gophers infesting Bushwood Country Club in Caddyshack.

He then accepted a tour of the course he will once again take on as he returns to the Championship which he has provided with so many colourful memories. Bill

even watered and raked some of the bunkers he will be trying to avoid this week.

He thanked his hosts and then drove away in his buggy, singing 'The Bonnie Banks o' Loch Lomond' as he returned to the Old Course Hotel – even attempting a 6am entry to The Jigger Inn, the hotel's legendary pub, on the way.

When that failed, Bill headed back to get some much-needed rest before beginning the Team Championship today with his partner, Brandon Stone. At Carnoustie that pairing are playing with the US Open champion, Matt Fitzpatrick – partnered by his mum, Susan.

And if, on Sunday, Bill finds himself in contention for the Team Championship on the Old Course and you see him standing over his approach on 18, don't be surprised if he channels Caddyshack's Carl Spackler one last time.

"Cinderella story, out of nowhere. Former greenkeeper, now about to become the Alfred Dunhill Links Champion..."

HISTORY BOY DANNY TARGETS TEAM TITLE

Danny Willett is one of only five golfers to win both the individual and team titles and he doesn't want to stop there

efending champion Danny Willett has set his sights on making more history at this year's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. The Englishman is one of an exclusive group – alongside Padraig Harrington, Michael Hoey, Nick Dougherty and Robert Karlsson – who have won both the individual event and the team competition.

Willett claimed his eighth DP World Tour title at St Andrews last year and in 2016 earned victory in the Team Championship with amateur partner Jonathan Smart. This year he hopes to better last year's third-placed team finish in partnership with amateur Jimmy Dunne.

Willett said: "Me and Smarty did it in 2016 after [Willett won the Masters at] Augusta. He carried me that week – I had a few drinks most nights! Me and Jimmy are hoping to go one better in the team event this year as well.

"It's a special week. It's the Home of Golf and we play three fantastic courses. I wanted to be able to say that I won around here. To be able to do it last year was special. I played great all week."

Despite the prospect of inclement weather, Willett insisted that nothing could spoil his enjoyment of one of the most unique weeks of the golfing calendar.

"It's everything that goes into it," he said. "That shows in who comes



to play and how much money they raise for charity.

"When you get all those people together on the Saturday night in a pavilion, you see how much the game means to so many people. I know the amateurs love coming to play and walking the same fairways that loads of golfers have done in the past. It's everything about it, the whole buzz around the town all week. It's just a special place."

"I would have loved it to have happened when we were here for The Open, but if I won here it would be very special and St Andrews is one of the places that I would like to experience winning."






OLD COURSE BOW FOR JASPAR AND COLE

Cole said: "I didn't expect to win because I was younger than many of the others. I've always wanted to play professional golf when I'm older."





DUNE RESTORATION IS KEY TO LINKS WILDLIFE

ot all the stars around our three beautiful Links have a golf club in their hands – as well as Major winners, Ryder Cup stars and Hollywood actors, visitors to the Championship can see a varied and stunning array of wildlife, thanks to the ground-breaking conservation work of the St Andrews Links Trust.

The dunes of the Fife Coastal Path surround the Old Course, Carnoustie and Kingsbarns. Not only do they offer a habitat to species including skylarks, pipistrelle bats and otters, but they also provide protection from the threat of coastal erosion.

The work of the St Andrews Links Trust does not end with the largest and longest-running dune restoration project Scotland has ever seen. It has established wild-flower meadows, bee introduction schemes, and bird boxes across the courses, to support the biodiversity of the coastline.



HOME COMFORT AFTER ROBERT'S ITALIAN JOB

After his victory in the Italian Open, Robert MacIntyre rushed to St Andrews to play in front of home crowd

obert MacIntyre feels like he is surfing the wave of Scottish sporting success as he prepares to tee up in this year's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. The 26-year-old Scot – who won this month's Italian Open after beating US Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick in a playoff – has been buoyed by his recent good form.

He has also been buzzed by a summer of Scottish sporting success, including gold medals for Laura Muir and Eilish McColgan at the Commonwealth Games and the success of Scotland's men's football team, who took a big step towards Euro 2024 in recent matches.

"I'm a diehard Scot," said Mac-Intyre, who is one of 12 Scots in the field, including former winner Stephen Gallacher, pictured below. "[The saltire] is on my golf ball every time I play. In sport, we get battered and told we are not good enough. For a small country, I think we punch hard. I've grown up playing all the sports – football, shinty, you name it, I've played it. To see Scotland doing so well in so many different sports now is brilliant."

MacIntyre revealed that he did not even have time to go home following his victory in Rome, choosing instead to head straight for St Andrews. "I've been playing well lately and it's good to get back on home soil with a little bit of form," he said. "It's always good to come home and play in front of home crowds. It's a different event. It's a nice, relaxed feel. I can go out, cruise around a little bit and enjoy myself."



AMATEURS
