MAGNIFIQUE! ROMAIN'S RECORD DAY

The Old Course record was matched by Romain Langasque as the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship was stormed by its own version of the Three Musketeers – Langasque, Frederic Lacroix and Antoine Rozner completed a French 1-2-3

Romain Langasque equalled Ross Fisher's Old Course record of 61 to claim an 11-under-par first round lead at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship in spectacular style.

And Langasque's fellow countrymen Frederic Lacroix and Antoine Rozner were not far behind him with a 62 and a 63, at Kingsbarns and St Andrews respectively, on a memorable day for French golf.

Denmark's Niklas Nørgaard Møller also shot a 63 at Kingsbarns, to lie in third place alongside Rozner, while Rory McIlroy, Shane Lowry and other big names playing

at Carnoustie – traditionally the toughest of the three courses – had to settle for supporting roles as day one was dominated by low scoring in the sunshine at St Andrews and Kingsbarns.

"I'm so happy, the last three holes were really fun, and I made some long putts," said the 27-year-old Langasque, who carded six birdies and an eagle in his last eight holes to tie Fisher's 2017 record, made at that year's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. "I didn't realise that I now have the course record here, but it is something I will remember for the rest of my life."

Tournament favourite McIlroy, meanwhile, had to be content with a four-under-par 68 at Carnoustie, as did Tyrrell Hatton, Robert MacIntyre and Francesco Molinari.

Lowry and Tommy Fleetwood, also playing at Carnoustie, shot 70 while US Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick and popular American Billy Horschel could only manage 71s there.

Langasque's heroics also gave him a share of the lead in the Team Championship. Langasque and Roy Ryu combined for a score of -14, matched by the team of Andrea Pavan and Kieran McManus.

FERGUSON AT FRONT OF CHASING SCOTS PACK

Ewen Ferguson spearheaded the Scottish challenge at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship with an opening round of 65 at St Andrews. The 26-year-old, who finished his round with a bogey on the Road Hole and a brilliant birdie on 18, was satisfied with his efforts, which left him six shots off the top of the leaderboard.

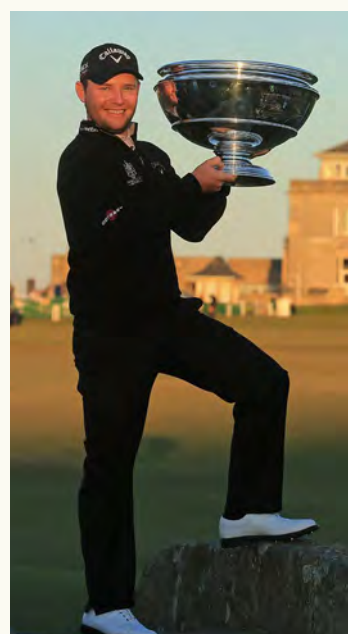
"I'm happy," he said. "I didn't feel like my swing was totally with me, but I felt some course knowledge helped. I had an unlucky bogey on 17, where I missed a six-footer for par. I felt I was due a putt and it was nice to make one on the 18th at the Old Course."

Ferguson faces a challenge at Carnoustie today, with the bad weather forecast, resulting in an 8.30am shotgun start.

"If the weather is going to be tough, it's going to be tough everywhere," he said. "If I can keep my head together and shoot even par, it shouldn't be disastrous."

Three Scots - including David Law, Connor Syme and Robert MacIntyre - are clustered together on four-under, with Stephen Gallacher on three-under and Grant Forrest and Richie Ramsay one stroke further back.

Ramsay enjoyed his round in the company of Dragons Den star Peter Jones, who was the amateur partner of the pro Daniel Gavins. He said: "I had a good chat with Peter about his life story, some of the adversity he's faced and how he got over it. For us, these guys are a wealth of knowledge."



GRACE'S AMAZING WIN, 10 YEARS ON

In 2012, a 60 at Kingsbarns fired Branden Grace to victory in an event that has also given him a priceless family memory

Branden Grace says the memories of his 2012 Alfred Dunhill Links Championship victory will come flooding back to him this week - 10 years on from the South African's stunning win in this event.

In 2012, Grace became the youngest winner in the history of

the tournament at 24 years and 140 days. He is also the only winner of both this tournament and its sister event, the Alfred Dunhill Championship in South Africa.

"It was a dream come true for me to win the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship," he said. "I grew up watching the tournament."

HICKORY TEST FOR CAPTAINS' CLUB

Michael Vaughan, Kevin Pietersen and Joe Root were joined by Piers Morgan for an Old Course challenge using hickory golf clubs – before raising a glass to an absent friend

Joe Root was eventually declared the winner of this year's Alfred Dunhill Hickory Challenge after taking on his fellow former England cricket captains, Kevin Pietersen and Michael Vaughan – plus broadcaster Piers Morgan – on the 18th hole at the Old Course on the eve of the tournament.

And afterwards, standing on the historic final green in fading light, all four toasted the memory of the late Shane Warne, the great Australian leg spinner who sadly died earlier this year at the age of 52.

“Warnie absolutely loved playing in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, every year he couldn't wait to get up here,” said Vaughan.

“He was just a special person and such a loyal friend,” added Pietersen as they raised their glasses of single malt to one of cricket's greatest players.

Vaughan also revealed that, last year, Warne bowled him out with an orange in a late-night impromptu game of cricket in the bar at the Old Course Hotel.

“I was only using an empty tequila bottle as a bat, mind you,” said Vaughan. “But Warnie spun down this orange, after bowling it with his usual action, and I swear that he also got it to drift in a bit – like he used to do with a cricket ball – and it was too good for me!”

Morgan had earlier introduced the three cricketers to a watching crowd, saying: “All three of them captained England, with varying degrees of success, eh Kevin?”

But Morgan was then quickly out of contention in the challenge, which is played every year using the hickory clubs that golfers would have employed from the turn of the century to the 1920s. He duffed his second shot out of bounds and Vaughan, whose drive hooked well left and almost off the course, could not match both Root and Pietersen's bogey fives.

Pietersen had hit the best drive, a booming effort down the left of the fairway, and he then found the putting surface with his approach. Root was also able to get on to the green in two.

From there, both Pietersen and Root's first putts left them with awkward five-footers for par and both missed.

A putt-off then ensued on the 18th green, and when this looked as if it would go on for some time, Pietersen generously missed the hole to leave Root the winner.

“Joe deserved it and, anyway, we don't want to be out here all night,” said Pietersen. Root was also the winner on the course yesterday, finishing the first round of the Team Championship at 10-under-par with partner Laird Shepherd.

His victory in 2012 was built around an incredible 60 at Kingsbarns in the first round and he is back there today, after finishing his first round at Carnoustie with a 2-under-par 70 yesterday.

“Starting with a 60 at Kingsbarns was unbelievable. Everything I looked at went in. I have never started a tournament like that.”

While winning remains a highlight for Grace, the memory of playing in this tournament with his late father Peter is an equally special one for him.

“A few years after I won, I was fortunate to play with my dad as my partner. That is a memory I will never forget.”



The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship celebrates links golf at its finest and is played over the Old Course at St Andrews, the Championship Course at Carnoustie and Kingsbarns Golf Links. The final round, after the cut is made on Saturday, is played over the Old Course.

With a total prize fund of US\$5million, there are two separate competitions – an individual professional tournament and a Team Championship, in which each professional is paired with an amateur.



BEWARE KINGS OF CARNOUSTIE

A dangerous group including two Major winners got the best of Carnoustie while the sun shone and are poised to challenge

Francesco Molinari's emotional return to Carnoustie saw him post an impressive four-under first round 68 to remain within sight of the leaders. The Italian - who is paired with football legend and countryman Gianfranco Zola in the team competition - memorably picked up the Open championship at the Angus links in 1988. The 39-year-old is handily placed to challenge over the weekend, with the weather due to close in today.

Another Carnoustie Open champion, Padraig Harrington, is a shot further back after an opening 69 on the course where he won his first major in 2007. The clement weather handed an advantage to

those who took on the challenge of Carnoustie yesterday and Tyrrell Hatton, twice Dunhill champion in 2016 and 2017, matched Molinari's 68, while Belgium's Thomas Pieters outscored them all with an excellent opening 65.


"I putted really nicely today," said Pieters "This is the third or fourth time I've played with my amateur partner [Brian Higgins] so we know each other and can joke. There's no nervousness. Playing in the same group as Kevin Pietersen was fun as well. There was a lot of swearing going on but in a good way, a lot of banter. I don't want to be beating balls in the wind [at Carnoustie], so I'll be fine at Kingsbarns [today]."



In 2013, American Peter Uihlein famously slam-dunked his wedged second shot into the hole on the 18th green at St Andrews to give himself a two-shot lead going into the final round. The 33-year-old - partnered with rock legend and Dunhill veteran Huey Lewis - en-

joyed himself on the Old Course again yesterday with a 65 to leave him four shots off the lead.

Another Open champion, Geoff Ogilvy - who picked up the US Open in 2006 - also made his presence felt on the leaderboard with a 66 at Kingsbarns.

NEW CLUBS, NO TIME FOR RONAN

Ronan Keating's brand-new golf clubs were left untouched as his music and broadcasting career left him with no time to play – but he believes that might be the secret to success this week.

Keating is paired with Scotland’s Connor Syme this year and they started with a score of 11-under par at St Andrews.



KELLY TAKES TO BEACH WITH WAVE PROJECT KIDS

Kelly Slater stepped off the 18th green at The Old Course and on to the West Sands beach to join a Wave Project surf session following his opening round at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

The 11-time world champion surfer, who also holds the records for being the youngest and oldest world champion in surfing history, spoke proudly of the impact his sport is having on the beaches of St Andrews.

“My message for the young people here today is just to keep doing it,” said Slater

“Once you catch a wave, you fall in love with surfing and it’s a life-long passion. If you want it to be your pastime, just do it once in a while, but a lot of these young people will hopefully fall in love with surfing and want to challenge themselves on different waves.”

The Wave Project uses ‘surf therapy’ to improve the mental health of children and young people in the local community.

Asked if the next Kelly Slater could come from the beaches of St Andrews, Slater smiled. “We’ll see! I’m surprised at how well they are doing, their patience and balance is impressive. I love coming here, to see surfing changing the lives of young people a short walk from the Old Course is special.”

After group pictures, selfies and tips for tackling waves from the greatest surfer of all time, Slater waved goodbye. But not before one final message: ‘Keep on surfing!’

He spoke at the university's Centre for Entrepreneurship, where he talked about his own business challenges and shared some words of wisdom with the budding entrepreneurs in attendance.

RECYCLING AIM PAYS DIVIDENDS

As the trees in St Andrews begin to shed their leaves, transitioning into the next stage of their cycle, materials used on-site during the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship will soon do the same.

Alfred Dunhill works with St Andrews Environmental Network towards their goal of net-zero waste to landfill from the event. In 2021, over 25kg of screws and six truckloads of wood were repurposed by the Men's Shed - an organisation that provides a space for men in the St Andrews area to share knowledge and get creative, helping their physical and mental health. The materials were used to construct wooden furniture.

Local primary schools and nursing homes received over 800 heather plants, whilst botanical and community gardens received netting and a huge trove of plywood was repurposed by Craigtoun Country Park.

YOUNG CONNOR KEEPS HIS COOL

15-year-old Connor Graham took time out from school to get a taste of life on the European Tour - and loved every minute

Among the professionals and celebrity amateurs gracing the fairways at this year's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship is local, up-and-coming teen sensation Connor Graham.

The fifth-year high school pupil from Blairgowrie in Perthshire was given a dream call-up to compete in the event, teeing off in the first round at Carnoustie yesterday.

At the tender age of 15, Connor is currently ranked 270th internationally by the World Amateur Golf Rankings for males, the sixth highest in Scotland. Last summer he secured a spot in the European & Home International Men's team championship played at Royal St George's. Connor is also a former R&A Junior Open Champion and was part of the Great Britain &

Ireland team which competed in the Jacques Leglies Trophy last summer.

In his debut round, he recorded a team score of 6-under-par playing alongside his professional partner, Sami Valimaki from Finland.

"It's definitely been good for my game having the opportunity to play with European Tour players," says Connor. "I made a few birdies out there and the course was in great condition. I think the par 3, eighth hole was the highlight: I hit a nice 5-iron to within ten feet of the pin and sank the putt."

He certainly didn't seem overly phased by the big occasion: "It's not too different from playing in amateur events," says Connor. "It's not been difficult to focus on my shots. It doesn't matter how many people are watching."



OLYMPIAN EFFORT AS STEVE HITS 21 NOT OUT

Olympic legend Steve Redgrave has another impressive record to add to his remarkable feats in a boat. The former rower is one of only five amateurs to have played in every Alfred Dunhill Links Championship since it began in 2001.

"This is my twenty-first," said Redgrave, who has joined up with 2013 winner David Howell in the team competition and they start their second round on 7-under-par.

"The first year, I was paired with Campbell and Campbell for my practice round at the Old Course. I thought it would be a couple of Scots, but it turned out to be [New Zealand professional] Michael Campbell and his dad. Michael said, 'stay left on this course and you won't have any problems'. I thought 'oh no, I'm a slicer!' I had a good round and we've stayed in touch since. The relationships you make are a big part of the week."

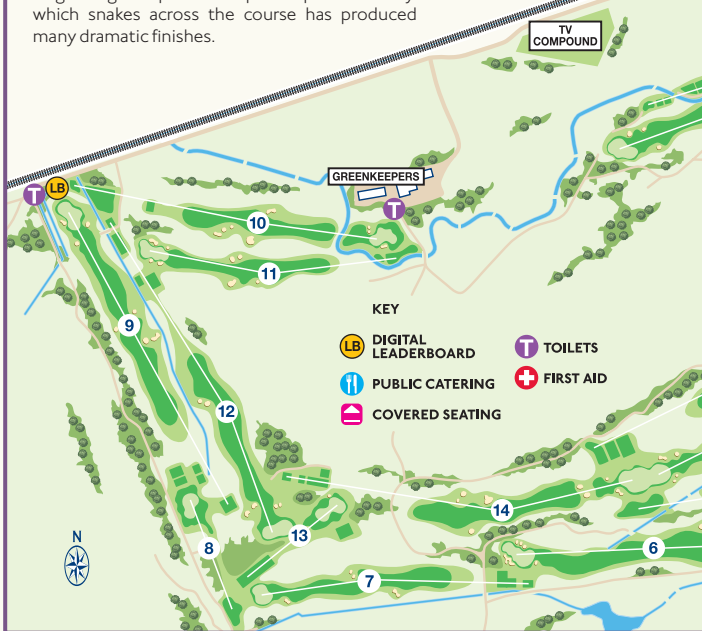
