MANSELL: A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS

England's Richard Mansell emerged as the new leader after rain and wind produced one of the most challenging days in the history of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – but the pitfalls of Carnoustie and a strong chasing pack await him

ngland's Richard Mansell produced a fighting 68 in challenging conditions at St Andrews to take the lead on 10-under-par at the halfway mark in the 21st Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

He goes in to today's third round leading by two shots from Sweden's Alex Noren and is a further shot ahead of Denmark's Niklas Nørgaard Møller and Frenchman Antoine Rozner.

While the local galleries applauded the men at the top of the leaderboard, they can be forgiven for looking a little further back to Bob MacIntyre, the great Scottish hope, who toughed it out in rain and wind for a two-under-par 70 at Kingsbarns to be just four behind.

MacIntyre, winner of last month's Italian Open, now has real hopes of becoming the first Scot to win the Alfred Dunhill Links since Colin Montgomerie in 2005.

Mansell, 27, has had an excellent 2022 season, qualifying for both the 150th Open championship at St Andrews and the US Open, and recording five top-ten finishes on the DP World Tour.

He moves on to Carnoustie today, the toughest course of the three, and said: "Just to be in that position is a really good thing. Still 36 holes to play, now Carnoustie. I'm really happy. Not much more

Having already played at Carnoustie, MacIntyre now takes on the more welcoming St Andrews. He said: "I'm playing well. My game is in great shape and I'm just going to enjoy myself, keep smiling and hopefully keep doing the same.

"The best attitude got you through today, and I was playing with somebody I get on really well with in Tyrrell Hatton, and we just had a laugh!"

BROTHERS TIED UP IN CHASING PACK

Matt and Alex Fitzpatrick play together today - with mum Susan in their four-ball to keep them in order

S Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick battled back from a tough start to his second round to card his second 71 in two days and remain just about in contention for a first Alfred Dunhill Links Championship title.

Also featuring in a group on twounder-par is American former Fed-Ex Cup champion Billy Horschel, the West Ham United fan who is partnering ex-Hammers captain Mark Noble and also added a second 71 to his score. Joining them is Matt's younger brother Alex, who shot a memorable three-under-par 69 at Kingsbarns.

But pre-tournament favourite and world No.2 Rory McIlroy is a stroke further back at one-underpar after adding a 75 at Kingsbarns to his first round 68.

Fitzpatrick summed up the feelings of virtually every player when he said: "It was horrible out there today -miserable, wet, cold and windy.

"But at least I had the best company as an amateur partner in my mum and a very nice four-ball that also included Brandon Stone and Bill Murray. We made the best of it, even though the weather was in the top three worst days I've experienced playing tournament golf."







'DON'T BE A HERO' -NOREN STAYS LOW

One of the rounds of the day came from the Swede who kept the ball – and his score – down to avoid trouble

weden's Alex Noren put in one of the most impressive performances on 'Ferocious Friday,' shooting a brilliant 69 at Kingsbarns and propelling himself into second place, two strokes behind leader Richard Mansell, going into his third round at the Old Course.

"It was a day on which you don't try to be a hero," said Noren after following his opening 67 at Carnoustie with a three-under-par masterclass in playing in such brutal conditions. "You couldn't really feel your hands because of the cold and wet and you had to keep the ball low, even when you were playing downwind," added Noren.

"But it was also a nice round and I played well. You have some extra room off the tee at Kingsbarns, so I thought it was quite a good place to be in those conditions.

"I'm pleased that it is still going to be windy at the Old Course over the weekend, as I quite like wind, but very glad it is not forecast to rain. I hate the rain."



PADRAIG CHANNELS HIS GREATEST HITS

hree-time Major winner Padraig Harrington recently turned 51, but he is showing he can still compete at the top of the leaderboard. His second round 71 at Kingsbarns left him four-underpar for the tournament and tied for tenth place.

"I am very happy with a 71," said the 2021 European Ryder Cup captain. "It was tough out there and the ball was not going very far. I'm six shots behind the leader, and in a good place."

Harrington has won this event twice - in 2002 and 2006 - and his 2007 Open Championship victory was also at Carnoustie.

"I have good memories when I come back up here," he said. "You

remember the shots you've played in the past and the emotions you had. One of the joys when you have won a Major is to return to the course you won it on."





EDDIE'S ACE IS THE ONLY BRIGHT SPOT

ddie Pepperell will at least have the lovely memory of a hole-in-one – struck with a 6-iron from 158 yards on the par-three eighth at Kingsbarns – to remind him of some of the most brutal weather he has experienced in professional golf.

Pepperell's overall verdict on the horrific conditions on day two of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship was succinct and to the point: "It's disgusting!" he said with a laugh.

"You just have to see the funny side of weather like this. The rain at times was so hard it was stinging your face and the wind was gusting all the time and very strong. It's definitely been one of the worst days I've played on, and to get such strong winds combined with all the rain is quite unusual."

Pepperell finished with a 74 at Kingsbarns, to lie two-under-par for the tournament, and added: "A hole-in-one definitely helps on a day like this!"





KATHRYN CAUGHT UP IN COLD WAR

Teammates on the course, Kathryn Newton and Matt Wallace have become rivals in a last-longer ice bath challenge

ollywood actress Kathryn Newton is not just aiming for birdies and eagles in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship she's also competing with her professional partner, England's Matt Wallace, to see who can last the longest in an ice bath following each day's round.

"Matt did ten minutes the other day, and I only managed four, but I am determined to try to beat him at some stage during the tournament," said the American star of Big Little Lies, who was a teenage golfing prodigy before making her acting breakthrough in Paranormal Activity 4.

"I am just having the best time



here and playing in such a great tournament makes me feel as if I am a real golfer. I was quite good when I was in high school, but I don't think I would ever have been good enough to become a professional golfer.

"I played off plus two at my best, but I have a handicap of one here, which I think is quite mean of them! But Matt Wallace has been so nice as my partner. I thought before meeting him that he would be quite intense, but he's so cool."

Kathryn and Matt headed to the next phase of the ice bath challenge at 5-under-par in the Team Championship after Friday's second round.



TIE AT THE TOP OF TEAM TABLE

The Team Championship remains delicately poised heading into the weekend, with a two-way tie at the top of the leaderboard.

The all-American team of pro Johannes Veerman and his amateur partner, entrepreneur Will Ahmed, share an overall score of 19-underpar with South African player Christiaan Burke and Canadian businessman Bruce Mitchell.

Swedish pro Kristoffer Broberg and his amateur partner from South Africa, Brand de Villiers, are one shot further back on 18-under-par.

eane's Tom Chaplin says hitting the golf course helps get his songwriting juices flowing. The singer has had a busy year playing live shows with the band and releasing a new solo album.

Chaplin said: "There are several things in my life which are more-or-less free and give me everything I need - fishing, football, writing songs... and golf. As I get older, the things that bring me greatest pleas-

ure are the ones that put me out in nature and allow me to be creative.

"I grew up playing Links golf at Rye in East Sussex. I'd like to think it has prepared me well for Dunhill, but I'm not so sure. I'm a streaky player. I rely a lot on timing and if it's on, I do well – and if it's not, I'm all over the place."

Chaplin is paired with English pro Jordan Smith in the team competition, and they finished their second round on 6-under-par.

DRAGON PETER IS TIGER-POWERED

Peter Jones got the best possible draw in a recent pro-am, landing some perfect advice from the 15-time Major winner

ragons Den star Peter Jones had the ideal preparation for this year's Championship - one-to-one coaching from Tiger Woods. The 56-year-old teed up with the 15-time major winner at a pro-am in Ireland earlier this year and made an early impression.



Jones said: "I was with Shane Lowry the night before, having a few drinks, and he said 'when you get on that first tee, every part of your body will be shaking'. He was right. There were 6000 people there applauding Tiger Woods. But you won't believe what happened - I hit a lucky first drive straight down the middle and an 8-iron to six feet from the pin, then birdied the first hole.

"Tiger got a four and he came over to me and said: 'hey, you can play.' My first hole with Tiger Woods and he calls me a player!"

Jones, on 9-under-par in the Team Championship with pro Daniel Gavin, added: "Tiger said to me, 'slow your game down. Imagine it's in slow motion'.

"He then told me to take an extra club. So, swing easy and take an extra club – two tips that suit well at St Andrews."

BLOOMBERG IS READY TO PITCH IN FOR HIS TEAM

The former mayor of New York is making his Dunhill debut and his pro partner can talk finance as well as fairways

t the age of 80, Michael Bloomberg is still embracing life with enthusiasm and a determination to keep busy and active. "When I got the invitation to play in this great Championship for the first time, I thought, 'what a great opportunity at this time in my life'," said Bloomberg, who was mayor of New York City from 2002 to 2013.

"I love the game of golf, even though I will never be any good at it. As an amateur, you can come in on a few holes to help with the team score, and there's always enough good moments in the day that you can enjoy."

Bloomberg was a candidate for the Democratic Party's presidential nomination in 2020, eventually losing out to Joe Biden, and is the co-founder and CEO of financial information, software and media firm Bloomberg. And that background has led to interesting conversations with his pro partner, Eddie Pepperell.

"He's a fun guy and we've been chatting about all sorts of things out there," said Bloomberg.

"Eddie's an intelligent guy and we've been talking about everything from international politics and finance to golf.

"This is only the second time I've been in Scotland. I did play at Kingsbarns four months ago when a group of us came over to visit this area, but all the courses are simply spectacular."


